Q2 PERFORMANCE.**

Dear Canpals,

CBOA has always upheld the philosophy that the welfare of its members is closely linked with the well-being of our mother bank. As a healthy body and healthy mind are mutually interdependent, so is employee welfare and health of the institution. There cannot be one without the other. Only if the mother bank remains healthy will the employee welfare be also taken care of. It is with this philosophy at heart that CBOA has always exhorted its members to "Own their responsibilities and achievements and demand their rights". CBOA has always taken pride in the fact that its office-bearers and members are performers in their official spheres also. This attitude of CBOA has resulted in the benevolent management being well-aware of the capabilities of CBOA and has immensely helped our office bearers in liaisoning with benevolent management.

It is in this backdrop that we should take great pride in the stellar performance of our bank in Q2 2021-22. Some of the highlights of our Q2 performance are as below.

- Net Profit stood at Rs. 1,333 Cr. ie a YOY increase of 200.22%.
- Operating Profit stood at Rs. 5,604 Cr with a YOY increase of 21.91%.
- Treasury Income grew by 95.10%.
- Non-Interest Income grew by 37.54%.
- Cash Recovery grew by 90.23%
- CASA Deposits grew by 12.04%.

- Retail Credit grew by 10.46% of which Housing Loan grew by 14.21%.
- Net NPA stood at 3.21% with a reduction of 21 bps.
- Return on Equity stood at 12.36% with YOY increase of 156%.

As is evident in the above figures, the stellar performance of our mother bank is very inclusive in the sense that there is considerable progress in all aspects of our performance like low cost liability side, assets side and most prominently asset quality side. Such a stupendous and all-round performance has been earned by the unflinching commitment and dedication shown by each one of our members. We should rightfully take pride and ownership in our contribution to this historic performance. The benevolent management has rightfully acknowledged our contribution by declaring the maximum PLI 15%. We would also like to express the gratitude of CBOA to the benevolence of our MD & CEO Sri L V Prabhakar, who announced Diwali Gifts to the entire workforce as soon as it was suggested by our General Secretary Sri K Ravikumar. This itself is the biggest acknowledgement of our efforts by our by our Top Management. As it is the officer

community of CBOA members who have been the heart and soul behind these results, this has also put CBOA in a position where our bargaining power has increased manifold and has opened the doors for us to demand more benefits and perks with the pride of our performance at our back.

However this is not a time to rest on laurels but to redouble our efforts in the second half of the year to finish strongly. Let us all pledge to work with the same commitment and dedication that has brought about such a great performance with the understanding that our welfare and the health of our mother bank share a symbiotic relationship. Let us all pledge to own our responsibilities and take our bank to greater heights so that we can demand our rights with our heads held high and empower CBOA to bargain for more industry best benefits for us.

To reap the full benefits, the program must be implemented in letter and spirit, by every Canpal across the country, and more particularly by the office bearers - The Torchbearers of our dear CBOA.

Friends, it is imperative, that the implementation of the initiative, across the lengths and breadths of the country be concerted - that is each and every Canpal shall voluntarily and whole heartedly participate in the program in line with the Action Plan charted below, so that our contributions, make a noteworthy impact on our Bank's Business Parameters and each and every Canpal owns the pride in taking our mother Bank to greater heights and glory.

09:00 A.M	Campaign Inauguration in the presence of Circle Executives and icons of the banking industry belonging to the respective town
10:00 A.M	Seminar on various topics, presented and participated by our Canpals
02:00 P.M	Lunch
03:00 P.M	Cultural programs by Canpals to display their talents

The Topics for the Seminar Session are as follows:

1. Reduction in Cost of Funds – A way to improve Profitability.
2. Increasing the Interest Yield – A way to foster sustainable Income.
3. Recovering the Overdues – A way to augment Net-Profit.
4. Happy Customers – A key to Success, and
5. Technological Innovations – A tool to remain afloat.

In addition, the contribution of Canpals, towards reducing the NPA Provision, by ensuring timely recovery in NPA accounts, particularly accounts classified as D4 & Loss Assets will make wonders to the coffers of the Bank, and will be the right step towards our goal of Rs 10,000 crores Net profit.

Hence, in continuity to my letter ref no: GS/ CBOA/ TTT/ 2021 dated 19.10.2021, and to realize the objectives, we set for ourselves, the following Action Plan/ Activities for NPA reduction, Recovery

in D4 & Loss Assets and Business Building, has been crafted and the same shall be effected in all the Circles / Regions by each and every Canpal with all earnest.

Action plan:

- The President of CBOA shall be the Chief Coordinator of the program.

The Chief Coordinator shall follow up the daily Circle-wise recovery activity report from the Circle Coordinators and shall monitor and guide the Circle Coordinators and other field level functionaries.

- Circle Coordinators (CCOs) shall:
 - a) Form a Circle level committee comprising of CC members and Regional Secretaries of the circle.
 - b) Activate the Regional Secretaries by collecting Region wise data on D4 and Loss assets

- c) Coordinate with the Regional level / District level office bearers and activists of CBOA by sharing the Region wise data on D4 and Loss assets
- d) Coordinate with the field level functionaries - RS/DS/RC members in the recovery of D4 and Loss assets.
- e) The CCOs shall also submit the consolidated report on daily recovery activity to the President. – Daily Recovery Report enclosed as Annexure.

• Regional Coordinators - Regional secretary shall be the Region level coordinator and shall;

- a) Form a Region level committee comprising of District secretaries, RC members and other activists in their respective command area.
- b) Initiate branch level recovery actions such as visiting NPA customers, preparing OTS proposals and conducting Can-Adalat's in coordination with the Regional Offices and Branch Staff.
- c) Regional Secretaries shall submit daily recovery activity report to their concerned CCO. - Daily Recovery Report enclosed as Annexure.

Activities to be undertaken:

1. Conducting awareness meetings on Asset Classification, Recovery Policy / OTS Schemes etc.
2. Facilitating the Branch Managers and the Recovery teams at CO/ RO in meeting the borrowers, organizing recovery camps and organizing Can Adalat's.
3. Assisting the Branch Managers in identifying the Non-Performing Assets and their Borrowers.
4. Facilitating the branches in One Time Settlement of NPA accounts.
5. Aiding the branches in recovering dues from D4 and Loss assets.
6. Helping the Retail Assets Hubs in processing and sanctioning Retail Loans.
7. Helping the branches in mobilizing Low Cost Deposits.
8. Assisting the branches by canvassing Debit and Credit cards.

9. Conducting regular weekly awareness programs on Credit, Technology Products, Vigilance., etc to our members in coordination with the RSTC staff.

Time Line for implementation of Action Plan:

1. All the committees are to be formed before 05.11.2021 and the list of the committee members both Circle level and Region level shall be made available to the President on or before 08.11.2021.
2. Data pertaining to NPA, INCIPIENT NPA, D4 AND LOSS ASSETS shall be collected and consolidated Region wise / District wise. The consolidated data shall be distributed to the Regional secretary / District secretary/ RC member on or before 09.11.2021.
3. Regional level meetings shall be conducted throughout the country simultaneously by the respective Regional Secretaries on 10.11.2021 (Wednesday) and the data shall be shared with the field level functionaries, the same day.
4. The program activities as stated above shall commence from 10.11.2021 simultaneously throughout the country.

Note: No office bearer shall meet customers without the presence of CO/ RO/ Branch Level Officials.

Friends, we Canpals have time and again proven that we can realize any goal that we set for ourselves.

TRUMPING THE TARGET – THE CANPALS STYLE is an initiative of Your CBOA that has set a self-imposed goal to achieve Rs 10,000 crores Net Profit.

To keep the stakeholders of the program motivated the following recognition system shall also be implemented during the program.

Best Regional Secretary/ District Secretaries shall be identified and issued with appreciation letters on a weekly basis.

Best CCOs shall be identified and issued with appreciation letter every month.

The daily Circle wise activity reports with photos shall be circulated through a separate Bulletin, which shall be released by the General Secretary, CBOA.

Sir,

In accordance with the provisions contained in sub-section (1) of Section 22 of the Industrial Dispute Act 1947, we hereby give you notice that CBOA, the second largest trade union for Officers' Associations in Nationalised Banks, proposes to go on STRIKE from 16h December 2021 to 17th December 2021, on the following issues, in support with the UFBU Call for agitational program against the proposed Banking Laws (Amendments) Bill, 2021.

1. Opposing Introduction of Banking Laws (Amendments) Bill 2021

2. Demanding nationalisation of old generation private sector banks

3. Demanding Updation of Pension The Statement of the Case is appended.

STATEMENT OF THE CASE

Whereas, the Union Government has listed the Banking Laws (Amendment) Bill 2021, for introduction and passage during the current winter session of the Parliament in furtherance to the Hon'ble Union Finance Minister of India, in her budget speech announced that the Government has proposed to take up the privatization of two Public Sector Banks.

This decision of the Government of India is without analyzing the ill effects of privatization of the existing Nationalised Banks. The private Banks which existed prior to Nationalisation or the new generation Private Banks have not contributed to the various inclusive financial welfare measures envisaged by various Governments over this period of time.

1 *We Oppose - Introduction of Banking Laws (Amendment) Bill 2021*

2 *We demand nationalisation of old generation private sector banks*

3 We demand Updation of pension

1. Introduction of Banking Laws (Amendment) Bill 2021

We strongly oppose and protest the Government's move tabling the Banking Laws (Amendment) Bill 2021 for introduction and passage with the objective of privatizing two Public Sector Banks, as announced in the Union Budget 2021 on 01.02.2021.

Under the Banking Companies (Acquisition and Transfer of Undertakings) Act of 1970, 14 Banks were nationalised on 19.07.1969 and under the Banking Companies (Acquisition and Transfer of

Undertakings) Act of 1970, 6 more Banks were nationalised on 15.04.1980.

The then Prime Minister of India, Smt. Indira Gandhi told the Lok Sabha on 29 July 1969 that the "purpose of nationalization is to promote rapid growth in agriculture, small industries and export, to encourage new entrepreneurs and to develop all backward areas". It was with the same objective that 6 more Banks were nationalised subsequently. The relevant Act for nationalising 6 more banks clearly spelt out that it is "In conformity with the Policy of State towards securing the principles laid down in Clauses (b) and (c) of Article 39 of the Constitution of India and for matters connected therewith or incidental thereto"

The move of the Government to Privatisise the banks which were nationalised under the above acts, amounts to breach of the Constitution of the Country. In the name of consolidation, number of Banks are being reduced. The advantages have been misquoted.

The core problem faced by the Indian banking industry is the enormous pile up of NPAs that have accumulated on account of faulty lending practices, absence of any effective strategy to recover the amounts from corporate houses and large borrowers and the volatile IRAC norms which are deliberately being changed frequently by the regulators to ensure that PSBs do not earn net profit at all.

The much-publicized Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code (IBC) process has not succeeded in recovering NPAs. On the other hand, it has resulted in substantial haircuts, leading to losses in banks and undue benefits to Willful Corporate Defaulters. The absence of strong penal action against the corporate willful defaulters and fraudsters reflect the lack of political will on the part of the Union government and exploitation of inherent system weaknesses by large borrowers than anything else.

With the Pandemic induced slowdown in the economy it is not unsurprising that the nationalized Banks have performed a turnaround as they reflect the state of the economy.

In this backdrop, the proposed move of privatization of Public Sector Banks (PSBs) is nothing but a diversion away from the core issue of NPA recovery and the overall economic situation of the country. Privatisation cannot resolve or clean up the balance sheets; rather the NPAs of the Privatised entities would simply be resolved through IBC involving huge write offs out of the tax payer's money.

The organizational disruption arising out of privatization would relegate every other activity to the backstage. Banks involved have to invest their precious time to do fire-fighting for next few years, in order to integrate personnel, processes and procedures adversely affecting other banking activities. Privatization will result in different classes of officers & staff within same organization. The industrial relations within the bank is bound to affect not only the officers & employees, but ultimately the very functioning of bank.

Hence, taking into consideration the overall welfare of the people of our country and towards building a healthy economic environment, we urge that the proposed move of privatization of Public Sector Banks be scrapped immediately and the Banking Laws (Amendment) Bill 2021 be withdrawn summarily.

2. Nationalization of old generation private sector

The growth phase of our Banks can be divided into two categories. Pre nationalization and post nationalization. Nationalization of Banks took Banking service to common man across the length and breadth of the country and helped in the economic development of the Nation.

Ever since, Nationalisation, Public Sector Banks opened branch across the country at even remote

places/hamlets where even less than 500 people live.

Public Sector Banks have presence at nearly 28800 rural places and at 24599 at Semi Urban places to cater the needs of public at unbanked areas.

The Banking Sector is the back bone of Indian Economy and it contributes for the development of the Nation despite of its many limitations. Nationalized banks have rendered selfless service for the growth of the country.

The participation of the nationalized banks as per India's Five year plan stands testimony for that. Be it the Green Revolution, White revolution, Blue revolution nationalized banks have played their part.

The growth of sectors like Agriculture, Micro & Small Enterprises, Services sector are a result of the public sector banks lending to these areas. Dreams of crores of youngsters in realizing their ambition of professional degree was made possible through Education Loans. Lending to Weaker Sections by Public Sector Banks helped in the uplifting of poor and downtrodden .

The success of various Government Sponsored schemes, creation of millions of entrepreneurs is a result of the nationalized banks' only. On Government's call for opening accounts under JANDHAN YOJANA, Public Sector Banks including Regional Rural Banks opened about 42.67 crore accounts out of the 43.94 crore accounts. To put it in proper perspective it is contribution of nationalized banks is 97 % of accounts.

The nationalized banks, with their social objectives over profitability, and directed lending to priority sector, weaker sections, minorities, have achieved a lot of ground in the stated objectives of nationalization during the past 5 decades.

Even after 50 years of nationalization, public sector banks still command more than 75% of the market share which proves the confidence enjoyed by the public sector banks with the general public

Considering the above, we demand that all remaining old generation public sector banks should also be nationalized.

3. Updation of pension

The Pension Regulations were formulated in 1995 and brought a sigh of relief for officers as they realized their long pending demand of pension and felt that their worries, of inflation rates eroding their life time savings due to real value of money going down, were removed.

Pension was hailed as the major social security measure available to officers after their hard work across various parts of the country. However, to the disappointment of officers, the element of updation was not made available in the Pension Regulations.

The "BASIC PAY" of the retiree is frozen on the date of superannuation, and is never revised in subsequent Bipartite settlements/ Joint Notes. Worst kind of discrimination is prevailing amongst different groups of retirees in the matter of payment of Dearness Allowance.

As such a senior executive who retired ten years back is drawing lesser pension than an entry level officer who retired in the previous year. This element of disparity has been taken up and remaining as a residual issue in wage settlement negotiations also.

The Pension Updation did not take place since 1992 and lakhs of Pensioners in the Banking Industry have left the world for their heavenly abode during the intervening period with a painfully inadequate monthly pension and a deep sense of hurt and neglect.

While finalizing previous wage settlements, it was assured that small committees would be constituted and the residual issues would be settled at the earliest. But there has been no progress in this direction.

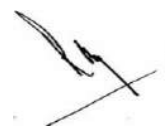
Retired officers and workmen have their own problems like health issues, staying alone in this new age while their children move elsewhere to earn their livelihood etc. Their requirements are met only by the Pension which they have earned after toiling for their lifetime.

Although Bank Pension Regulations were framed on the lines of Pension Scheme that was in force in Reserve Bank of India, no steps have been taken to remove the discrimination / disparity in respect of updation of pension / family pension and place these pensioners on par with RBI pensioners.

While the retirees of Reserve Bank of India were also governed by similar Pension Regulations, based on the demands of the retirees, Ministry of Finance approved updation of their Pension in 2019 itself.

Hence, we demand that the updation of pension should invariably been extended to the retirees of all the Nationalised Banks.

CBOA WELFARE SCHEMES

HOSPITALISATION SCHEME	In case of major operation or hospitalization for a long duration, an amount not exceeding Rs.2,00,000.00 (Two lakh only) shall be reimbursed under this scheme to a member on account of hospitalisation of self, spouse and children which is disallowed by Medical Expenses of the Bank.
HONOURING MEMBERS RETIRED	A suitable memento worth • Rs.5000.00 shall be given to all the officers, who is our member for less than three years, retiring on superannuation. • Rs.10000.00 shall be given to all the officers, who is our member for upto five years, retiring on superannuation. • Rs.20000.00 shall be given to all the officers, who is our member for more than five years, retiring on superannuation

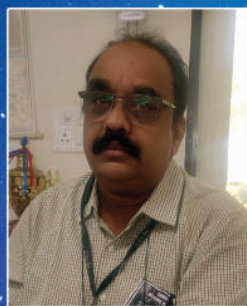

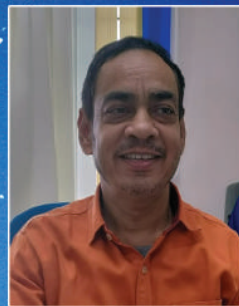
